226 Harvey Variance Voted Down

The Community meeting held on September 3 focused on a zoning variance to convert a single-family home into 6-units. Over 35 neighbors expressed concerns about parking, building capacity, work done without permits, and general lack of trust in owner/contractor given past experiences. The 29 votes cast were unanimously opposed. This was based on voting

by 20 near neighbors and 9 "not near" neighbors. The ZBA is scheduled to hear the case on 11/19 at 9:30. As that date approaches, we will instruct all neighbors on how to attend the hearing and/or where to write letters concerning the case.

Providence Baptist Church of Germantown at 78 E. Haines

Congregant, Denise Way, with help from the Historical Commission of Philadelphia staff, has nominated her church to the Register of Historic Places.
